



ADVANCED STANDING AND RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING PROCEDURES - SCHEDULE 1

Establishing Equivalence of Prior Learning

The University utilises the following processes to guide the award of credit and application of credit amounts.

EQUIVALENCE OF OVERSEAS QUALIFICATIONS

The equivalence of an accredited overseas qualification/award is established when the University receives your application, and then use the Australian Education International [Country Education Profiles](#) or other appropriate guide such as the United Kingdom National Agency for the Recognition and Comparison of International Qualifications and Skills ([UK NARIC](#)), for comparing international courses to [AQF levels](#).

EQUIVALENCE OF NON-FORMAL LEARNING

The equivalence of a non-accredited course, seminar, on-the-job training or professional development program is established when the University assesses your application, using a detailed mapping process.

EQUIVALENCE OF INFORMAL LEARNING

The equivalence of years of service in an occupation, voluntary role or life experience is established when the University assesses your application, using the tables in Appendix 1 as a guide to comparability, adapted from the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO).

ANZSCO [skill levels](#) measure:

- the level or amount of formal education and training;
- the amount of previous experience in a related occupation; and
- the amount of on-the-job training.

The minimum experience and combinations of lower study that may substitute for holding a qualification is listed in [Appendix 1](#).

Credit Amounts

The following credit amounts normally apply for related prior learning¹.

Credit is awarded for the highest level of related learning achieved in the same or a closely allied discipline/field/branch of learning. Generally, the University awards credit once per qualification level. For example, holding two related Diplomas (or a double diploma) provides a maximum of 8 units credit, not 16 units.

INTO RELATED MASTERS DEGREES

Where an applicant seeks entry into a **Masters Degree** with a related program/course/qualification/award or equivalent experience, credit will normally be awarded as follows:

Into a Masters Degree - 8 unit – 96 Credit Point – 1 Year

Up to 2 units (24 CP) for completion of more than half of the units in a Masters Degree (AQF level 9 or equivalent);

Into a Masters Degree - 12 unit – 144 Credit Point – 1.5 Years

4 units (48 CP) for a Graduate Diploma (AQF level 8 or equivalent);

Into a Masters Degree - 16 Unit – 192 Credit Point – 2 Years

8 units (96 CP) for a Bachelor Honours Degree or Graduate Diploma (AQF level 8 or equivalent);

4 units (48 CP) for a Graduate Certificate (AQF level 8 or equivalent);

8 units (96 CP) for a Bachelor Degree (AQF level 7 or equivalent) and a Graduate Certificate (AQF level 8 or equivalent);

4 units (48 CP) for a Bachelor Degree (AQF level 7 or equivalent).

INTO RELATED BACHELOR HONOURS DEGREES OR GRADUATE DIPLOMAS

Where an applicant seeks entry into a **Graduate Diploma** with a related program/course/qualification/award or equivalent experience, credit will normally be awarded as follows:

¹ Less credit may be granted due to partially related learning in a different discipline/field/branch of learning, external/professional recognition requirements or mandatory units in the study plan, for which credit does not apply. More credit may be granted for greater alignment of learning outcomes, through waiver by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academic.



Into a Graduate Diploma – 8 Unit – 96 Credit Point – 1 Year

4 units (48 CP) for a Bachelor Honours Degree, Graduate Certificate or Graduate Diploma (AQF level 8 or equivalent).

INTO RELATED BACHELOR DEGREES

Where an applicant seeks entry into a **Bachelor Degree** with a related program/course/qualification/award or equivalent experience, credit will normally be awarded as follows:

Into a Double Bachelor Degree – 32 to 36 Unit – 384 to 432 Credit Points – 4 to 4.5 Years

- 24 units (288 CP) for a 3 year Bachelor Degree (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 16 units (192 CP) for an Associate Degree (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 12 units (144 CP) for an Advanced Diploma (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 8 units (96 CP) for a Diploma (AQF level 5 or equivalent);
- 4 units (48 CP) for a Certificate IV (AQF level 4 or equivalent);

Into a Bachelor Degree – 24 Unit – 288 Credit Points – 3 Years

- 16 units (192 CP) for an Associate Degree (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 12 units (144 CP) for an Advanced Diploma (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 8 units (96 CP) for a Diploma (AQF level 5 or equivalent);
- 4 units (48 CP) for a Certificate IV (AQF level 4 or equivalent);

Into a Bachelor Degree – 32 Unit – 384 Credit Points – 4 Years

- 24 units (288 CP) for a 3 year Bachelor Degree (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 16 units (192 CP) for an Associate Degree (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 12 units (144 CP) for an Advanced Diploma (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 8 units (96 CP) for a Diploma (AQF level 5 or equivalent);
- 4 units (48 CP) for a Certificate IV (AQF level 4 or equivalent).

INTO RELATED ASSOCIATE DEGREES

Where an applicant seeks entry into an **Associate Degree** with a related program/course/qualification/award or equivalent experience, credit will normally be awarded as follows:

Into an Associate Degree – 16 Units – 192 Credit Points – 2 Years

- 12 units (144 CP) for an Advanced Diploma (AQF level 6 or equivalent);
- 8 units (96 CP) for a Diploma (AQF level 5 or equivalent); 4 units (48 CP) for a Certificate IV (AQF level 4 or equivalent).

INTO RELATED DIPLOMAS

Where an applicant seeks entry into an **Diploma** with a related program/course/qualification/award or equivalent experience, credit will be awarded as follows:

Into a Diploma – 8 Units – 96 Credit Points – 1 Year

4 units (48 CP) for a Certificate IV (AQF level 4 or equivalent).
