

ADMISSION AND COURSE REQUIREMENTS STANDARDISED WORDING GUIDELINES

Course Developers should use the standardised wording unless this would result in inconsistency, ambiguity or confusion in which case contact the Manager, Course Implementation and Publications for advice on alternate wording.

UCMS Users please note:

- Content in italics should be adapted as appropriate to the particular course.
- Remove italics prior to entering into UCMS.
- Be specific and clear with the use of 'or', 'and', and 'and/or'.
- If other special course or entry rules apply, for example additional hurdles such as the LANTITE test, add these to the end of the relevant list as the final bullet point.
- With respect to 'equivalent' in the admission requirements note:
 - An Australian Higher Education Provider is equivalent to an Australian University.
 - Overseas qualifications will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
 - For some awards, relevant professional experience and previous study below the required level may also be considered.
- With respect to 'equivalent' in the course requirements, 'equivalent' refers to the fact that some units may not be single weighted.
 - One unit is usually 12 credit points, although units may be half-weighted (6 credit points), double-weighted (24 credit points), tripleweighted (36 credit points) or quadruple-weighted (48 credit points).
- 'Complete' in the course requirements includes any units credited via advanced standing.
- Majors/Shared Majors comprise 96 credit points (8 units) in an undergraduate degree and are named on the testamur for example, Bachelor of XYZ majoring in Major Name. A Major is eight identified units with no option to select units.
- Minors/Shared Minors comprise 48 credit points (4 units) in an undergraduate degree and are not named on the testamur. A Minor comprises 4 identified units, with no option to select units.
- Specialisations are a combination of units in a course, with a total credit point value commensurate with the volume of learning in the course that is recognised by potential students, educators and professionals as qualifying a student for further learning of professional practice within a specific field of study or field of practice. If needed, seek advice from the Manager, Course Implementation and Publications regarding the wording for course requirements. The Specialisation Name is printed in brackets under the title of the degree.
